

Retreat Cabins

Mariposa (#1), Agape (#2) and Harris (#5)

Each of these three cabins includes: meeting space for thirty, fireplace and “snack suitable” kitchenette, restrooms and showers. Each cabin contains six bedrooms with five beds in each (two bunks and a twin, all beds standard twin width and extra long), totaling thirty beds.



Rustic Cabins

Numbers 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 & 9

Six rustic one-room cabins are available on the West side of camp with restrooms and showers located nearby at LaPoint Hall.

Rustic cabins may accommodate a maximum of eight persons with bunk bed accommodations. There is no meeting space in these cabins.

Meeting Space

- Each of our three Retreat Cabins has meeting space for thirty persons.
- Large groups have use of LaPoint Assembly Hall for meeting space.
- The Dining Hall is considered informal gathering space for all groups to share coffee and conversation



Other

Two motel-style rooms are available at LaPoint Hall. These rooms have two twin beds, and a restroom in each.



Food Service Information

- Our food is served family style and we take pride in providing delicious and well-balanced meals.
- All groups are expected to assist with dining set-up and clean-up.
- Six days prior to arrival you will need to contact us with your participant numbers in order for us to make food purchases.

Deposit and Payment Information

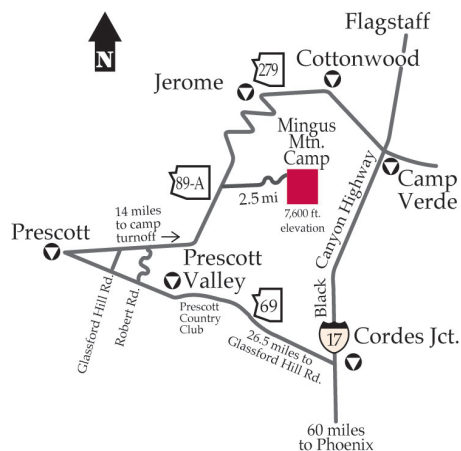
- Within 30 days of making a reservation, your group is asked to submit 40% of the total reserved building use fee.
- 60 days prior to your retreat date you are asked to submit an additional 30% of the total reserved building use fee.
- Your group's account (remaining 30% building use fee plus food service fees) must be paid in full within 15 days following the retreat experience.

Mingus Mountain United Methodist Camp is a beautiful mountaintop retreat encompassing 110 acres in ponderosa pine forest. Located near Jerome, the camp is at the 7,700 foot summit of Mingus Mountain within the Prescott National Forest. Our rustic environment and open grassy meadow make the camp especially popular for youth and family oriented church camps. Our spacious new retreat cabins are ideal for adult groups too.

The camp may be reserved in its entirety, in clusters, or per retreat cabin. We strive to match shared users of similar nature and program. Smaller groups share the use of grounds, fire circle, outdoor chapel and recreational facilities. A group may have exclusive use of the camp by reserving 80% or more of our cabins.

During our spring and fall retreat weekends the camp is open from Friday evening through Sunday afternoon. Meals begin with Saturday breakfast and end Sunday lunch (five meals). Meal service is provided for groups from 20 to 140 persons.



Accessibility

Although new construction is aimed at achieving improved levels of ADA accessibility, the majority of our facility, paths and trails are not handicapped accessible.

Due to the rustic nature of our facility, mountain terrain and 7700' elevation, not all persons or groups are suited for this rustic camp facility.

Policies

Each group is responsible for providing their own medical personnel.

Each group is responsible for leaving the facilities clean and in good condition.

Campers bring their own toiletries, towels and bedding.

Pets are not permitted at camp.
